### Schedule Change for Celebration of Life

Jane McMillan Hendrix McGann (74) passed away peacefully at Autumn Care of Myrtle Grove on January 8 2026 in Wilmington, NC after battling cancer and kidney failure. Jane was born June 1 1951 to Thomas K Hendrix and Eleanor McMillan Hendrix in Decatur, IL. She is survived by her brother Thomas Hendrix Jr. and stepchildren, Patricia, Janet, John, Susan, Cheryl and Karen.
