George was born July 20, 1915, in Chicago, and at the age of 8 moved to NY. He attended Lincoln School. Then he studied in Paris and Germany. He went to Black Mountain College in NC and the graduated from Stanford in 1938, then University of Chicago, and on to Vint Hill Farms as a cryptologist.

In WWII he was in the Alaska Defense Command. Then worked for the State Department, where he was responsible for economic research in the UK and Scandinavian countries. This was followed by work for the Marshall Plan in Paris. He was in politics in Marblehead, MA., and elected to two terms as Selectman. He began his own company, Tour Arrangements Inc.
