Howard Barnes, 89, passed away on Wednesday May 31, 2023 at Novant Medical Center in Wilmington NC. Howard known as PawPaw to all who knew him, was born in Charlotte NC on May 16, 1934 to Ida Jane Barnes and William Brady Barnes.
