Every Christmas when I came in, Jack would stop whatever he was doing and take me into the cigar room. Jack knew his friends well and knew what my Dad wanted and liked. That didn't stop him from letting me look at all of the different cigar displays, probably, asking very silly questions about each one. I always came up with a new brand that I thought looked very "good", and he would always convince me to get a few "that he just knew my Dad would like." He would walk me to the register and pretend to ring up the cigars. With at least \$50-\$100 of cigars he "somehow" totaled everything to just under what I had in allowance.
